

Key Questions

How do humanists decide what to believe?
 Why don't humanists believe in a god or gods?
 What are humanists' views on happiness?



Key Knowledge

The belief that human beings are special and human life is valuable.
 The absence of belief in a God or Gods, and the absence of belief that we can ever know that there is a God.
 The belief that human beings can find their own way to be happy.
 The belief that human beings should be good to each other. (the Golden Rule).
 To recognise the Happy Human as a symbol of humanism.
 To recognise that humanists mark key moments in life (birth, weddings and deaths).
 The absence of good or persuasive evidence for an afterlife.
 The nature of Humanism: not a religion, but a philosophy.
 The existence and diversity of humanist thought throughout human history and around the world.
 Understanding the humanist values and being able to discuss these.
